

The Indus Valley civilization, one of the oldest in the world and dating back at least 5,000 years, spread over much of what is presently Pakistan. The area underwent successive invasions from the Persians, Greeks (Alexander the Great), Scythians, Arabs (who brought Islam), Afghans, and Turks. The Mughal Empire flourished in the 16th and 17th centuries; the British came to dominate the region in the 18th century. Pakistan, with its East and West sections, gained independence in 1947 after the Partition of the British Indian Empire, which awarded separate statehood to its Muslim-majority regions and was accompanied by an unparalleled mass migration and loss of life. A war between Pakistan's East and West Sections, resulted in East Pakistan becoming the separate nation of Bangladesh in 1971. Wars in Afghanistan sent four million refugees to Pakistan.

In response to Indian nuclear weapons testing, Pakistan conducted its own tests in mid-1998. India-Pakistan relations remain strained – particularly over the fate of the Indian-occupied State of Kashmir.

Pakistan, with the world's sixth largest standing army, is designated as a major non-NATO ally by the United States. Pakistan has strong economic, cultural and educational linkages with the U.S.

Pakistan presents a rich mosaic of breathtaking tourist destinations ranging from lofty mountains in the North to riverine valleys, plains and deserts in the middle part and vast sandy beaches to the south. The Karakorum Highway, the highest paved road (15,000 ft) connects Western China and Pakistan. It provides the pathway to expeditions of some of the world's highest peaks.
